Maitland Hospital is progressing well...

It was one of the most exciting days in my time as the Member for Maitland to visit the new Maitland Hospital at Metford. It will be a fully public hospital thanks to the efforts of everyone in our community who fought for it - the NSW Labor Opposition, the NSW Nurses and Midwives Association, the Health Services Union, the Australian Salaried Medical Offices Federation and the community. Yes, every single person who signed a petition, or attended a rally, or wrote a letter calling for this new hospital can be very proud of this facility.

The building is looking fantastic: from the Cardiac Catherisation Lab, MRI and CT scanning spaces, 6 birthing suites with spas, ICU units, negative pressure rooms, spacious and state-of-the-art operating theatres, calm inclusive gathering/ waiting spaces and children's play spaces, the rooftop helipad and the incorporation of First Nations art and local flora in the building designs. These and many other aspects of the building are the result of extensive consultation with staff and input during the ten years we have waited for this new facility.

From a \$400 million promise in 2011, we now have a \$500 million hospital. The new building will have 339 beds, up from 188 beds at the current hospital, and has already attracted significant investment in radiation and chemotherapy services nearby, both at the existing Maitland Private Hospital and opposite the new hospital. We will have access to the oncology (cancer) services and even clinical trials that our growing community deserves.

Maitland Men's Shed lifts off

The Maitland Men's Shed secured **\$64,261** for a more inclusive accessible space for all ages.

I am pleased I was able to deliver funding for such an important and vital organisation in our community. It's a wonderful place for men to get together to work on meaningful projects, share skills and contribute to the wider local community.

Local Sporting Grants Announced

I was delighted to inform nine organisations (some received multiple grants) of their success in the latest round of the 2020-21 Local Sport Grant Program. Normally \$50,000 is allocated to each electorate for the program but due to remaining funds available from undersubscribed electorates, I was able to secure funding for an additional two organisations. The successful organisations were; East Maitland Athletic and Little Athletics Centre, Lochinvar Rovers Football Club, Maitland Croquet Club, Maitland District Motorcycle Club, Maitland Hockey Association, Maitland Junior Football Club, Maitland Meteors Softball Club, Maitland Rugby Blacks Netball Club, Majestic Netball Club. It is expected that another round will open later this year.

Dine & Discover Vouchers Extended

After much pressure from industry and the Opposition, the NSW Government extended the date of the Dine and Discover Vouchers until 31 July 2021.

About two in every three adults across NSW have registered for the vouchers, but only 44 per cent of vouchers have been redeemed, so there are many people (and more importantly, businesses) who are missing out on the two \$25 dining vouchers and the two \$25 entertainment vouchers!

If you're a NSW resident aged over 18, you can

apply for the vouchers through the Service NSW website or through the Service NSW app. You'll need your MyServiceNSW account and two identity documents, like a Medicare card or licence.

Please Support Tourism Businesses!

Tourism was the first sector to be impacted by COVID, and with international tourism severely impacted, our state's tourism industry is still suffering. While some regions are booming, Sydney and Western Sydney are not, and we are seeing a massive loss of skills in the tourism sector.

After JobKeeper ended in March, the NSW Government promised they would pilot an accommodation voucher scheme for impacted hotels in the Sydney CBD and then roll it out to other areas that had been impacted such as Western Sydney and regional areas beyond a day's drive from Sydney. Other states have provided tourism vouchers to residents to encourage tourism in impacted areas. For instance in the Northern Territory, accommodation vouchers of up to \$200 and up to \$200 fuel vouchers are available for residents visiting regional and remote areas.

Victoria has rolled out 80,000 x \$200 tourism vouchers for accommodation, attractions and tours in regional Victoria. Sadly NSW has failed to provide any similar targeted assistance to NSW tourism operators.

Please remember to support our local tourism businesses who have been doing it tough through the pandemic!

Mouse Plague - Too Little Too Late

For over 8 months people in NSW have been battling the mouse plague. Incredibly, after sustained drought, catastrophic bushfires, COVID and flooding, the NSW Government has been very slow to act to protect our farmers and local communities from this plague.

When the CWA and the NSW Farmers came to the NSW Parliament in May to draw attention to their plight, the Agriculture Minister and the Deputy Premier labelled it a "PR Stunt".

This is despite evidence of people being bitten in their beds, in hospitals, and farmers losing up to \$150,000 in crops, after spending the same amount on zinc phosphide. Many regional areas report that they are low on stock for mice baits and traps.

Reluctantly, after much pressure from the Labor Opposition, the Government promised \$50 million, however nothing rolled out for the first month. Finally in June, the Government increased the package by another \$100 million, but there are still concerns about whether or not the Government will release Bromadiolone.



This toxic chemical requires approval from the Federal APVMA and if approved for use, will have significant impacts on our environment, and potentially kill many more animals than the mice it was intended to control.

Due to the Government's inaction, we have many people suffering health and mental health effects. Please take care using any baits or poisons to kill mice. We have had reports from people suffering ill health due to incorrect usage. Always follow the directions.

Regional Seniors Travel Card Year 2 Applications - Hurry!

Eligible Maitland seniors may qualify for a \$250 prepaid card to help ease the cost of travel. The card can be used at certain retailers to pay for prebooked NSW Trainlink Regional trains and coaches, fuel and taxis.

The travel card is valid for 14 months from the date the card is issued. Applications for 2021 opened on 18 January 2021 and will close on 30 November 2021.

Just recently the program was extended for an additional 2 years and from 2022 will include those eligible for the Age Pension and receiving either a Disability Support Pension or a Carer Payment from Services Australia.

Fed up with congestion on our local roads?

On 23 May I hosted a public meeting at Thornton regarding congestion on our roads. Whilst I have continued to ask Government to address the traffic issues at the Maitland Railway Station Roundabout, with the Government's half overpass; the local and regional traffic at Thornton has become increasingly congested over the last 10 years with massive population increases.

In 2010 Labor commenced a project to duplicate the bridge at Thornton but this work has not been completed by the Government. In addition, the NSW Government received \$167 million from stamp duty in this post code area in 2018, but failed to approve a \$51 million grant application from Council to address the congestion caused by the population increase.

The meeting was well attended, with over 140 people registering to attend either at the venue or online. I have communicated the outcomes of the meeting to the Minister for Regional Transport and Roads as well as drafting a petition. Maitland Mayor, Councillor Loretta Baker, as well as Councillors Robert Aitchison and Ben Whiting addressed questions from the floor during the meeting. Other Councillors in attendance did not speak, and not all attended.

I raised these issues at a recent Traffic Committee Meeting and the with the Minister. Some issues are already under active investigation, and I urge you to go to https://www.maitland. nsw.gov.au/projects/thorntonroad-network website to get the facts on what Council and the State Government have done to address congestion at Thornton.

FIX OUR ROADS IN MAITLAND GIVE US OUR FAIR SHARE

To the Honourable Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales. This Petition of the citizens of New South Wales brings to the attention of the House that in 2018, the Berejiklian-Barilaro government collected \$167 million in stamp duty from the 2322 postcode alone. In the same year, the Government refused an application from Maitand City Council to contribute \$51 million to a \$100 million road project to connect the New England Highway and Raymond Terrace Road at Thornton. This connection is vital to residents across Maitland, particularly in Thornton, Chisholm, Woodberry, Metford, East Maitland and Tenambit, as well as those to the north including Largs, Bolwarra and Lorn. The undersigned petitioners therefore ask the Legislative Assembly to provide the requested funding to upgrade the Thornton road network and upgrade Metford Road and Chisholm Road.
